

AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT dated this 21 day of March, 2016.

BETWEEN:

NORTH ISLAND 9-1-1 CORPORATION

Courtenay, BC V9N 3P6

(the "North Island 9-1-1 Corp")
OF THE FIRST PART

AND:

CITY OF CAMPBELL RIVER

301 St. Ann's Road
Campbell River, BC V9W 4C7.

(the "Campbell River")
OF THE SECOND PART

WHEREAS:

- A. Under a contract agreement dated the April 1, 2013 (the "Contract"), the North Island 9-1-1 Corporation and the City of Campbell River entered into an agreement for the provision of fire dispatch services and agreed to the terms and conditions specified therein.
- B. The parties have agreed to amend the Contract on the terms and conditions set out in this agreement (the "Amendment Agreement").

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Amendment Agreement and in consideration of the sum of \$10.00 now paid by each of the parties to the other the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the parties agree to amend the Contract as follows:

1. Amendment to Definitions

Section 1.0 of the Contract is amended by deleting the definition for "Operating Expenses".

2. Amendment to Obligations of Campbell River

Section 2.0 of the Contract is amended by deleting section 2.2 (a) in its entirety and substituting with:

"Provide the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Center, with ten (10) qualified employees who are trained in emergency dispatch operations and a point eight (.8) full time equivalent of a 9-1-1 fire dispatch centre manager, who is experienced in fire department management.

3. Amendment of Obligations of North Island 9-1-1 Corp

Section 3.0 of the Contract is amended by deleting section 3.2 (a) in its entirety and substituting with:

"(a) pay all capital expenses of the 9-1-1 fire dispatch system, except for computer equipment used by the fire dispatch manager and fire dispatchers for City of Campbell River business and computer equipment on the City of Campbell River's computer network."

Section 3.0 of the Contract is further amended by deleting section 3.2 (b) in its entirety and substituting with:

“(b) pay to Campbell River a fixed price of \$1,166,423 for fire dispatch service delivery (the Services) for calendar year 2016 pursuant to the letter from Campbell River to North Island 9-1-1 Corp dated January 26, 2016.”

4. Amendment of Payment Schedule

Section 4.0 of the Contract is amended by deleting section 4.0 in its entirety and substituting with the following section 4.0:

4.0 Payment

4.1 North Island 9-1-1 Corp will pay to Campbell River for the provision of the Services under this Contract in accordance with section 3.2 (b) of this agreement in equal quarterly instalments effective January 2016. Any adjustment required to the January 2016 quarterly payment will be made in April 2016.

5. Amendment to Schedule C

Schedule “C” Operating Expenses of the Contract is amended by deleting Schedule “C” in its entirety.

6. Ratification

Except as expressly amended by this Amendment Agreement, the parties ratify and confirm the Contract. The Contract and this Amendment Agreement shall be read and construed as one document.

7. Time


Time shall remain of the essence of the Contract and of this Amendment Agreement.

8. Counterpart





CITY OF CAMPBELL RIVER

301 St. Ann's Road
Campbell River, B.C.
V9W 4C7

(hereinafter called "Campbell River")
OF THE SECOND PART

WHEREAS:

- A. North Island 9-1-1 Corp's purpose is to operate an emergency response dispatch system ("the System") and such ancillary purposes relating to the System.
- B. Campbell River, through the Campbell River Fire Department, has agreed to act as the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre ("9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre") for the System and will provide emergency response dispatch services to all fire departments included in the System, and;
- C. Campbell River and North Island 9-1-1 Corp wish to define their respective rights and obligations for the operation and funding for the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and obligations set out below, North Island 9-1-1 Corp and Campbell River hereby agree as follows:

1.0 GENERAL

1.1 Interpretation - In this Agreement:

"Equipment" means the equipment, materials, publications, spare parts and supplies provided by North Island 9-1-1 Corp to operate and manage the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre.

"Fire Departments" means the fire departments identified in Schedule 'B' as amended from time to time by North Island 9-1-1 Corp, which Schedule is attached to and forms part of this Agreement.

"9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre" means the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre to be operated and managed by Campbell River under this Agreement.

"9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Operating Guidelines" means the general operating guidelines as amended and maintained by the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Manager to ensure the ongoing efficient and effective operations of the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre.

"9-1-1 Fire Dispatch System" means all radio, computer, telephone, recording, mechanical and electrical systems (attached to the 911 network system) used for the delivery of fire dispatch services within the area served by North Island 9-1-1 Corp, managed and operated by Campbell River through agreement with North Island 9-1-1 Corporation.

"9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Manager" shall be a deputy fire chief of Campbell River Fire Department or designate/s appointed by the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Manager or the fire chief of Campbell River Fire Department from time to time.

"9-1-1 System" means the 9-1-1 Emergency Answering and Dispatch Systems managed by North Island 9-1-1 Corp for the provision of both a Primary Public Safety Answering Point and a Secondary Fire Public Answering Point and Dispatch System.

"NFPA 1221, Chapter 7" means the National Fire Protection Association, Standard 1221, Chapter 7, as amended from time to time.

"Operating Expenses" means the operating expenses defined in Schedule 'C', which is attached to and forms part of this Agreement.

"Services" means the services described in Schedule 'A', which is attached to and forms part of this Agreement.

- 1.2 **Term** - The term of this Agreement is five (5) years from the effective date of this Agreement. This Agreement may be extended for one additional five (5) year term by either party unless written notice of termination is given not less than eighteen (18) months before this Agreement expires.

2.0 **OBLIGATIONS OF CAMPBELL RIVER**

- 2.1 **Provision of Services** - Campbell River shall provide the Services to operate and manage the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch System on behalf of North Island 9-1-1 Corp in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

- 2.2 **Staff** - Campbell River shall:

- a) Provide the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Center, with qualified employees who are trained in emergency dispatch operations and a 9-1-1 fire dispatch centre manager, who is experienced in fire department management. The time allocated to manage the 9-1-1 fire dispatch will be at least proportionate to the salary sharing percentages in Schedule 'C'.
- b) The management of the 9-1-1 fire dispatch centre shall include but not be limited to responsibility for:
 - i) Overall direction, planning, organizing, administration and training of 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre staff;
 - ii) Creating and maintaining operating guidelines for both external and internal 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre users.
 - iii) Providing reports as required by and make recommendations to North Island 9-1-1 Corp;
 - iv) Attending North Island 9-1-1 Corp management, administrative and board meetings;
 - v) Establishing protocols to promote efficiency of the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre;
 - vi) Liaising with and maintaining a close cooperative working relationship with the Fire Departments and North Island 9-1-1 Corp's Mapping and Database Manager for the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch System;
 - vii) Recommending and assisting with the operations and maintenance of the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch System;
 - viii) Provide notification to the North Island 9-1-1- Corp when unexpended expenses are realized resulting in budget overruns;
 - ix) Maintaining the staffing levels in the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Center, as required by

North Island 9-1-1 Corp's policies. The minimum standards will be in accordance with the NFPA 1221, Chapter 7; as amended from time to time. Any changes will be processed in accordance with the collective agreement between the IAFF and the City of Campbell River;

- x) Providing technical advice to North Island 9-1-1 Corp;
- xi) Providing contract management services for suppliers and contractors engaged by the North Island 9-1-1 Corp for the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch System;
- xii) Providing North Island 9-1-1 corporate secretary with an annual schedule of 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre Manager's vacations, training and out of province travel plans;
- xiii) Advising prior to any scheduled vacation or other leave not related to 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre business, by the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Center Manager, the name and contact information for the designated 911 Fire Dispatch Center Manager to ensure ongoing coverage of operations; and
- xiv) Providing ongoing reporting with regard to call volume, quality assurance and other information as required by the North Island 9-1-1 Corp.

2.3 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Operations - Campbell River shall provide the necessary training and supervision to ensure that its employees are in compliance with North Island 9-1-1 Corp's policies: 9-1-1 dispatch centre operating guidelines and shall work towards operating at the NFPA 1221, Chapter 7 standard for dispatch operations level.

2.4 Protection of Equipment - Campbell River shall make all reasonable efforts to ensure the protection of all equipment, and the training in the proper use of all equipment is maintained, further that all equipment is maintained in good working order. Campbell River shall include guideline(s) for disaster recovery in the operating guidelines.

2.5 Responsibility - Campbell River is responsible for any damage to the equipment caused by a willful act or omission of its employees but Campbell River is not responsible for normal wear and tear of the equipment.

2.6 Fire Dispatch Services - Campbell River shall provide emergency response dispatch services to the Fire Departments during the term of this Agreement.

2.7 Dispatch Outside Boundaries - Campbell River shall not knowingly dispatch any Fire Department for fire suppression or rescue Services to a location beyond the legally defined or agreed to in writing, fire protection or rescue boundaries of that Fire Department.

3.0 OBLIGATIONS OF NORTH ISLAND 9-1-1 CORP

3.1 Supply of Equipment - North Island 9-1-1 Corp shall:

- a) supply and maintain all the Equipment attached to the 9-1-1 system network necessary for Campbell River to provide the Services, and
- b) retain ownership of all the Equipment.

3.2 Costs - North Island 9-1-1 Corp shall:

- a) pay all capital expenses of the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch System;
- b) reimburse Campbell River for the Operating Expenses incurred by Campbell River, with respect to the operation of the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre, as set out in Schedule 'C'; and
- c) waive any right to claim against Campbell River and save harmless and indemnify Campbell River, its officers, agents and employees from claims, loss and damage at 675 – 13th Avenue, Campbell River, BC, arising out of or resulting from a seismic event, North

Island 9-1-1 Corp acknowledging that the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre was constructed in 1978 in accordance with the provincial building code in effect at that time and that the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre is not designed to comply with current seismic design requirements.

- 3.3 Corporation Policies** - North Island 9-1-1 Corp may establish policies that it determines to be necessary for the administration of the 9-1-1 fire dispatch operations. North Island 9-1-1 Corp shall advise Campbell River, in writing, of any policy that the 9-1-1 fire dispatch centre is required to comply with.
- 3.4 Notice of Policy Changes** - North Island 9-1-1 Corp's policies may be amended from time to time by North Island 9-1-1 Corp, and Campbell River shall be given not less than thirty (30) days written notice of any changes in the policies before compliance is required.
- 3.5 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Operating Guidelines Changes** – the 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Manager shall ensure that all new or revised operating guidelines are forwarded to the North Island 9-1-1 administrative offices to update the master 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Operating Guidelines.
- 4.0 FINANCIAL PLAN**
- 4.1 Proposed Five-Year Financial Plan** - Campbell River shall provide North Island 9-1-1 Corp with a proposed five (5) year Financial Plan for the Operating Expenses no later than November 1 of each year.
- 4.2 Recommended Five-Year Financial Plan** - Recommended changes to the proposed five-year Financial Plan may be submitted no later than February 15 of each year.
- 4.3 Approval** – Approval of the Campbell River current year financial plan shall be subject to the adoption of North Island 9-1-1 Corp's annual budget no later than March 31 of each year.
- 4.4 Payment** - North Island 9-1-1 Corp will pay to Campbell River for the provision of the Services under this Agreement, on a quarterly basis as follows:
- (i) In January, 1/4 of the amount approved in the Financial Plan for the previous calendar year;
 - (ii) In April, 1/4 of the amount approved in the financial plan for the current year subject to a pro rata adjustment for January through March for differences in the Financial Plan amounts approved for the previous year and current years' operations;
 - (iii) In July and October, 1/4 of the amount approved in the financial plan for the current year.
- 4.5 Records** - Campbell River shall keep and maintain a complete set of financial records for the Operating Expenses, including but not limited to all invoices, receipts and employment records. Once, during the five year term, the North Island 9-1-1 Corp will have the option of engaging the services of an external accounting firm to review or audit the financial records relating to the Operating Expenses and will provide reasonable notice to Campbell River of the audit or review. The City, upon receiving such reasonable notice, shall provide access to the financial records to the North Island 9-1-1 Corp or its agent for the purpose of the audit or review, the cost of which will be at North Island 9-1-1 Corp's expense.

- 4.6 Accounting for Operating Expenses** - On or before July 30th and January 30th of each year, Campbell River shall provide North Island 9-1-1 Corp with a complete financial accounting of all Operating Expenses of the previous six (6) months.
- 4.7 Annual expenditures - Year End Adjustment** - Within thirty (30) days of the end of each fiscal year (December 31), Campbell River shall submit an accounting to North Island 9-1-1 Corp, approved by the finance manager, showing monies advanced by North Island 9-1-1 Corp under Clause 4.4 and the actual Operating Expenses of Campbell River during that year recorded in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards for British Columbia local governments.
- Campbell River shall repay North Island 9-1-1 Corp any excess of advances over the Operating Expenses or invoice North Island 9-1-1 Corp for any excess of Operating Expenses over advances made..

5.0 INSURANCE

- 5.1** North Island 9-1-1 Corp shall indemnify and save harmless Campbell River, its officers, agents and employees from all claims, loss and damage arising out of or resulting from the operation of the System except to the extent that such claims, loss and damage are contributed to by the willful negligent, acts, errors or omissions of Campbell River, its officers, agents or employees.
- 5.2** Campbell River shall indemnify and save harmless North Island 9-1-1 Corp, its officers, agents and employees from all claims, loss and damage arising out of or resulting from the negligent acts, errors or omissions of Campbell River, its officers, agents or employees.
- 5.3** North Island 9-1-1 Corp shall indemnify and save harmless Campbell River against any legal defense costs to a maximum of \$50,000.00 per claim incurred by Campbell River by reason of its being named a party in any legal proceeding arising out of or resulting from the operation of the System so long as Campbell River is ultimately found not to be liable.

6.0 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 6.1 Cooperation** - North Island 9-1-1 Corp and Campbell River shall cooperate and use their best efforts to ensure the most expeditious implementation of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 6.2 Disputes** - In this clause, "dispute" means any dispute arising out of or in connection with this Agreement or in respect of any defined legal relationship associated with it or derived from it or any matter requiring the agreement of the parties under this Agreement.

North Island 9-1-1 Corp and Campbell River agree to make bona fide efforts to resolve any dispute arising between them by amicable negotiations and to provide frank, candid and timely disclosure of all relevant facts, information and documents to facilitate those negotiations.

If a dispute is not settled with fifteen (15) days of the appointment of the mediator, or such further period of time agreed by the parties, it shall be referred to and finally resolved by arbitration under the arbitration rules of procedure of the British Columbia International Commercial Arbitration Centre.

7.0 TERMINATION

- 7.1 Right to Terminate** - Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time, without penalty, and for any reason, by giving eighteen (18) months notice in writing to the other party, with the effective date to be no earlier than December 31 of the following year.

8.0 REPRESENTATIONS

8.1 Prior Negotiations - All prior negotiations and agreements between the parties related to the subject matter of this Agreement are superseded by this Agreement.

8.2 No Representations - There are no representations, warranties, understanding or agreements other than those expressly set forth in this Agreement or subsequently agreed to in writing by a duly authorized representative of North Island 9-1-1 Corp and Campbell River.

9.0 WAIVER

9.1 Failure to Enforce Not Waiver - Any failure of North Island 9-1-1 Corp or Campbell River to enforce or to require the strict performance of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall not, in any way, constitute a waiver of those provisions or affect or impair those provisions or any right North Island 9-1-1 Corp or Campbell River has at any time to avail itself of any remedies that may have for any breach of these provisions or to require the Services to be performed in accordance with this Agreement.

9.2 Waiver in writing - Neither party is bound by a waiver of any provision of this Agreement unless the waiver is clearly expressed in writing and signed by the party's representative.

10.0 LAWS

10.1 Proper Law - This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Province of British Columbia.

10.2 Compliance - Campbell River shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations.

11.0 SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

11.1 Benefit - This Agreement shall operate and take effect for the benefit of, and be binding upon, North Island 9-1-1 Corp and Campbell River and their respective successors and, in the case of North Island 9-1-1 Corp, its assigns.

11.2 No Assignment - This Agreement or any rights accruing under it may not be assigned by Campbell River.

12.0 NOTICES

12.1 All notices and demands required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and addressed as follows:





SCHEDULE 'A'**THE SERVICES**

Campbell River shall provide the following Services in accordance with N.F.P.A. 1221, Chapter 7 standards, as amended from time to time:

9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Center.

9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Center, employees trained in Emergency Dispatch operations (Section 2.2 of this Agreement).

9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Center, Manager, experienced in fire department management (Section 2.2 of this Agreement).

Emergency calls within the System's area however received, shall be appropriately recorded and tabulated to indicate the source or origin.

The appropriate Fire Department will be notified of the emergency as soon as all pertinent information has been received, and this shall be in accordance with the 9-1-1 fire dispatch operating guidelines.

Where there is any doubt regarding service area boundaries, the local fire department being dispatched is responsible to determine the appropriate response.

Records will be kept showing the time the emergency call was received, when the Fire Department was dispatched, the time a unit responded to the emergency call, the arrival of the first unit at the scene and the time the command is terminated.

The 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre will notify other agencies when they are required for emergency assistance by a Fire Department. These agencies are:

SCHEDULE 'C'**OPERATING EXPENSES**

Operating Expenses for the provision of the Services are to be recorded by Campbell River in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards for British Columbia local governments. The actual annual expenditures—year-end adjustment statement, showing Operating Expenses, which is to be submitted to the North Island 9-1-1 Corp within thirty (30) days of the end of the fiscal year (December 31), is to be approved by the Campbell River finance manager. All reconciliations of operating expenses will be based on actual expenses rather than budgeted expenses.

Note 1:

Administration: 9-1-1 Fire Dispatch Centre Manager (a Deputy Fire Chief of the City of Campbell River) @ 80% salaries and benefits.

Dispatch Operations: Campbell River shall provide 1.4 FTE – Fire Dispatchers (salary and benefits) in recognition of administration and dispatch services provided to Campbell River. North Island 9-1-1 Corp shall provide salary and benefit costs for all other Fire Dispatchers. The calculation is based on the total costing for the 9.9 FTE, prorated for 1.4 FTE paid for by Campbell River.

Benefit costs, including sick leave, shall be determined and calculated based on the prevailing accounting policies of Campbell River as disclosed in their annual audited financial statements and allocated on the same basis as the Fire Dispatch Centre Manager and Fire Dispatcher FTEs.

Note 2:

Effective April 1, 2014, in recognition of human resource and financial support services provided by Campbell River with respect to the services provided under the Agreement, there will be an annual support services fee of \$20,000.

Note 3:

Annual lease plus leasehold improvements as necessary. This annual lease will include all utilities and building operating costs, including maintenance associated with provision of the generation of emergency power. The rate of annual lease shall be:
